



ROLLED INTERFACING

Great for providing body & stiffness to cuffs, collars & waistbands

Interfacing is placed on the wrong side of the fabric and is sandwiched between fabrics, so it's generally not seen. Make sure the interfacing is the same width as the material it will be applied to.


Wigan

Wigan is a woven cotton. It provides a nice stiffness to other woven fabrics. The grain of the fabric should match the grain pattern of the wigan. Choose between sew in or fusible wigan. Be sure the fabric that you use can accept the heat needed for the fusible style.



Tricot

Tricot has a grain line and is silky and lighter than wigan. It tends to provide more stretch in one direction than the other. These are great for knitted fabrics.



Non-woven

This does not have a weave and can be used on most any fabrics. These fibers will break down a bit faster than woven interfacings after multiple washings. Choose between regular weight or light weight depending on stiffness needs and materials being used.
